

MAIN

This is the main logo for FBMAG. Whenever possible this version should be used without alteration.

The font of the wording is Baskerville Regular. The ampersand (&) is Baskerville Italic.

No effects are to be added to the logo. This includes, but is not limited to, Outer Glow, Drop Shadow, Gradients or Embossing.

The logo must never be rotated.

The elements must not be moved around. They are to be shown in this order only and in this colourway.



When placed with other elements on a design there must be a clear space of no less than 5mm around the design. This gap should grow exponentially with the size of the logo.

The logo can be placed on colour background that doesn't limit visibility. It is not limited to the examples above. But windows, doors and the clock face must match the background colour and not remain white.

REVERSED





When visibility of the main logo is compromised then this reversed version should be used. As with the main logo (and the portrait logos further in this doucment). All design rules must be adhered to.

PORTRAIT

When space is an issue when using the main logo. This portrait version is to be used instead.
